

Mary was an outstanding Chair for the HCEF Awards Banquet and the International Conference Registration! Her attention to detail, organizational skills and professionalism were second to none! Year after year, Mary and Tom would labor together, painfully counting and labeling each and every Holy Land Gift item in the HCEF storeroom. HCEF was honored by their level of commitment and support in this capacity. Her grace, input and skill always helped us to make each event even more successful!

We have only listed a few of the many, many ways in which she has blessed us. 



# HCEF's Children's Peace PROJECT (CPP) Recognized

by the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council

On August 8, 2012, the Knights of Columbus, the largest Catholic benefit society in the world, recognized the vision and excellence of its Chelsea Michigan Council, which sponsored the HCEF Children's Peace Project—the 4-week visit of 5 Palestinian students and their teacher chaperon—in the summer of 2011. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson conferred the *only* award for international impact from the Knights of Columbus at the 130<sup>th</sup> Supreme Convention in Anaheim, California. The award was accepted on behalf of the Chelsea Council by past Grand Knight Owen Ballow, who was also a host father for one of the Palestinian Students. Palestinian children, with their innocence and their values, are the seeds and the prophets of peace between Palestine and the U.S.A. They embodied joy and painted smiles on the faces of their American host families. This project is one of the foundations' ways of touching American hearts, and telling them more about the Palestinian reality. The HCEF Children's Peace Project enables American churches and schools to work for greater understanding and solidarity with churches and schools in the Holy Land. The hosts invite a small group of Palestinian students and a teacher to reside in the parish or school community for six to eight weeks if during the school year, or a shorter period if during the summer. The objective of the CPP is to build a bridge of understanding and peace between the Holy Land and the West and between the children of both lands.



**Father Turner**, pastor of St. Mary Parish and host of the summer 2011 Children's Peace project, insists "It is important to connect with the descendants of Jesus' time. To see the world as we are seen by others. The Christians in the Holy Land are diminishing in numbers, as the Israelis continue to hem them in and restrict their movements...but we have created a bridge for them. They know that we are willing to support them and their various projects, livelihood, and works. Our people came to better understand their plight as a people under occupation, and unable to live in dignity."

Father Turner is a true Holy Land priest and recently joined the HCEF Board of Directors.

# 🗷 Arab Christians of the Holy Land 🖷


After two thousand years, Christian families are still living and worshiping in the land where Jesus was born, died, and was resurrected. These Christians are not immigrants.
They are not converts from Judaism or Islam. They are the descendents of those who first believed in Jesus Christ. They live in Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Nazareth, and other places in the Occupied Territories and Israel. They are Arab Palestinian Christians – Orthodox, Catholic, and Protestant. Together, they comprise the Mother Church.

Their plight is twofold. First, these Christians have lived for more than fifty years under an unrelenting military occupation, and their living conditions today are desperate. Palestinian Christians face the daily threat of personal violence. Their homes are often confiscated or demolished, and they are rarely issued permits to build new homes. There are few job opportunities for Palestinians, and unemployment is rising. Medical care is inadequate, and supplies and patients are held at military checkpoints without permission to pass. Roads are closed in and out of villages — some roads are designated for Israeli use only. Palestinian identity cards are often confiscated, preventing Palestinians from moving freely within their own territories. Water is periodically cut off and cisterns have been destroyed, and Palestinian Christians in the Holy Land feel that they are the forgotten faithful. Many Christians from around the world do not even know that there is an indigenous Arab Christian population in the Holy Land. Even fewer know the severity of the conditions they are forced to endure. The mainstream media simply do not depict the daily lives of Palestinian Christians.

It is easy to see how the Palestinian Christians have come to feel as though they suffer in solitude, without the solidarity of the rest of the Body of Christ. It is also easy to see why Christians are leaving the Holy Land in vast numbers. In 1948 the Christian population of the Holy Land was over 18%. Today, it is less than 2%. In Jerusalem, in 1944, Christians numbered 30,000. Today, that number has dwindled to 2,000.

The Christian population shrinks daily as Christians emigrate to safer conditions. In a study conducted in 2001 by the Latin Patriarchate of Jerusalem (the Roman Catholic diocese), it was determined that 53% of the Christian residents of Beit Sahour (a predominantly Christian town adjacent to Bethlehem) had taken steps within the last year to acquire emigration visas. The

Holy Land Christians are the living church in the land where Jesus was born, died, and was resurrected. They do not want to leave the land that their families have lived on for centuries. If they continue to leave at their current rate, there will soon be no living church in the Holy Land. There will always be holy sites to visit, but there will be no living stones, no living Body of Christ.

The Ministry has also received an Apostolic Blessing from Pope John Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI.

Tom and Mary have traveled to the Holy Land more than 40 times since 1984. Their work includes travel to parishes in California, Kansas, Louisiana, Mexico, and within Texas to give presentations on their ministry experiences. In June 1989 and June 1990, they assisted the pastor of St. Ignatius Parish in Belize City, Belize, in a parish-wide evangelization effort. Tom was ordained to the permanent Diaconate in August 1988. Their ministry work has been featured in five nation-wide Catholic periodicals and on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) show, 'Living His Life Abundantly' in 1995 on the video 'I Am the Bread of Life,' produced by Stepstone Productions, Inc. In February 2008, they received of the Catholic Television of San Antonio (CTSA) Leadership Award. In March 2011; they received the "Pescador de Hombres" Award from Guadalupe Radio Network for their service in the South Texas. In October 2011, they were invested into the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem, a Papal Order.



**Rev. Richard H. Graham** was elected to a six-year term as bishop of the Metropolitan Washington, D.C.

Synod of the ELCA on June 8, 2007, by the 2007 Synod Assembly. He took office on September 1, 2007, and was installed on October 14, 2007.

Bishop Graham most recently served as pastor of Hope Lutheran Church in College Park, Maryland. Additionally, he has been Assistant Pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Hagerstown, Maryland; and Associate Pastor of St. Martin,Äôs Lutheran Church, Annapolis, Maryland. Bishop Graham received a Master of Divinity degree from Harvard Divinity School, Cambridge, Massachusetts, in 1977 and a Master of Arts degree in Church History from the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C. in 1989.

Prior local leadership included as synod secretary, member of the synod, Äôs Candidacy Committee and member of the Board of Trustees of the National Lutheran Home for the Aged, Rockville, Maryland. Bishop Graham succeeded the Rev. Theodore F. Schneider who retired from the position after serving two terms following his election in 1995.

Bishop Graham is married to Nancy Ann Graham and has two adult daughters.

Foundation. Ms. Hill has worked for the

past ten years in her own company as Executive Vice President & Co-Founder of ServiceElements, a corporate training organization that specializes in "core skills" training. **Dr. Jad Isaac** was born in 1947 in Beit Sahour to a middle class family that traces its roots to 1563

AC in this Shepherds field town. Dr. Isaac was born in Beit Sahour. He joined the faculty of agriculture at Cairo University and graduated with honors from the food science department in 1968. He also worked as an extension agent in Ramallah at the Department of Agriculture until he resigned in 1969 to work as chemistry teacher in Bethlehem secondary schools. In June 1974, he married Ghada Andoni and they were blessed with four children.

In 1973, he pursued his post graduate studies at Rutgers University where he graduated with a M.Sc. degree in food science. He returned to Palestine to resume his work and joined Bethlehem University as part-time instructor of biology. In 1976, he organized the first science educational expo in Bethlehem which included a large collection of Palestinian flora and fauna as well as a large number of scientific demonstrations and experiments. In 1976, he received a scholarship from the British Council to pursue his Ph.D. studies at the Food Research Institute at the University of East Anglia. He joined Bethlehem University as an assistant professor and headed the Department of Life Sciences. He later became the Dean of Science at Bethlehem University.

In 1985, he co-founded the Economic Development Group as a non-profit finance institution to promote entrepreneurship and authentic development in Palestine. He initiated and was the Editor in chief of Bethlehem University Journal from 1980 until 1987. In 1986, he was awarded the Abdul-Hamid Shuman's prize for Arab Biologist of the Year. In 1987, the first intifada broke out and Dr. Isaac became a leader in the non-violent civil resistance. for which he was arrested. Following his release, he co-founded important institutions in Palestine, including the Orient House, the Palestinian Center for Rapprochement Between People, and the Applied Research Development Group-Jerusalem, which promotes technology transfer in the Palestinian community.



**Mr. Hassan Qasem** is a Chairman of PITA (Palestinian Information Technology Association) which

represents the ICT companies in Palestine and Chairman of PICTI(Palestinian Information technology incubator). Furthermore, Mr. Qasem is the Chairman of Young Scientist Club, and Board member of PSD (Partners For Sustainable Development). Experienced entrepreneur and CEO of several companies in IT, software, and web, he is currently the chairman of Dimensions Company which was established in 2007 by Palestinian businessmen, providing exceptional business and health care consulting services.

Prior to forming Dimensions Consulting Company, Mr. Qasem worked as an IT Instructor in Birzeit University from 1992 until 2000. In 1996, he established his own company Arab Technology Systems (ATS) which was sold to PALTEL Group in 2006. Mr. Hassan Qasem holds a Master degree in computer science from The American University – Washington D.C. 1992.



Mario Nazal Momares is Cofounder of "Bethlehem 2000 Palestinian Foundation," the most important

Chilean non-profit organization created to help Palestinian children in the Holy Land, Mario Nazal is a Chilean businessman, first generation born in Santiago of Palestinian parents from Taybeh.

After high school, he studied chemistry and pharmacy at the University of Chile, but had to stop before receiving his final diploma because of his father's illness. From that point on, however, he became fully involved in his family business, and became counselor of "Sociedad de Fomento Fabril," the most important Chilean industrial businessmen group in the country, president of the Chilean Textile Industries, a founding member and currently Director General of "Bethlehem 2000 Palestinian Foundation," and founder of Al Damir, the only Chilean magazine directed towards the Arab community, entrepreneurs and business leaders. He received several awards for successful industrial entrepreneurships. He is fund-raising for major projects for Palestine, such as Macklube, the traditional and annual dinner for the Arab community in Santiago; an annual fashion show, and a complete system of donors to afford health and education programs for the most

needed. He is in partnership with the Palestine Children's Relief Fund, providing health support in two ways; sending Chilean volunteer medical missions for surgical work in Palestine, and receiving in Chilean homes Palestinian young people who need to receive medical care in Santiago.



**Eng. Amal Masri Moghrabi** is the general manager and founder of Al Moghrabi Consulting Engineering Office.

She is also is an architect who graduated from Jordan University, Amman, in 1986. In 1987, Amal, along with her husband, established their own engineering office, Al Moghrabi Consulting Engineering Office in Ramallah, which is now one of the most well-known engineering offices in the governance.

Through her career life, Amal designed and supervised many distinguished, residential and commercial, buildings such as the 'Best Eastern Hotel,' the 'Paltel' building in Al-Masyoon, 10 buildings at the new Rihan neighborhood, many famous projects and buildings cooperating with Al-Quds Company, as well as many villas in Ramallah and all the surrounding villages. Mrs. Moghrabi was chosen to be one of the consultants in Rawabi city, the first Palestinian planned city, which is the largest private sector project ever carried out in Palestine. In addition, she has been an engineering consultant of the following: Deir Dibwan Municipality, Beir Nabala

Municipality, and the Palestinian Bar Association.

As a business woman, Amal is one of the 7 founders of the Business Woman Forum (BWF) in Palestine, becoming chairwoman in 1990. She has represented the BWF in many local and international conferences and meetings. Moreover, Amal is a national team member at the Ministry of National Economy, participating in the Project for the Advancement of National Product. She's a member in the steering committee of the Jericho Project, and a member of the national dialogue of the income tax law, which is held by Dr. Salam Fayyad, the Prime Minister.



Rateb Y. Rabie, KCHS is the President of the Holy Land Christian Ecumenical Foundation. He was

born in Amman, Jordan to Palestinian parents. He immigrated to the U.S. in 1976. He is a U.S. citizen. He holds a degree in business administration. From 1981 to 1986, he was the Director of Operations for Saudi Support Services, Ltd. In 1988 he moved to Washington, DC where he is manager and proprietor of several businesses.

Being a life long advocate for peace and justice, in 1999 he joined with others to establish the Holy Land Christian Ecumenical Foundation (HCEF). This was based on the firm conviction that if American Christians became aware of the desperate conditions of the Christians in the Holy Land, they would reach out and help.

He is the past National President and

current board member of the Birzeit Society and Vice President, Treasurer and co-founder of the Institute for Health, Development and Research in Palestine. He is a member of the Knights of Columbus and a Knight Commander of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. In 2006, he received the *Birzeit Society Award* and the *Faith and Tolarance Award* from the Arab American Antidiscrimination Committee.



Dr. Asad Abdul Rahman is Executive Chairman and member of the Board of Trustees of the Palestine

International Institute (P.I.I.). In his very distinguished career, he has served as Executive Committee Member (P.L.O.), Ex- Minister of Palestinian Refugees and Head of Palestine Refugee Negotiation Team in the Final Status negotiations.

He has also served as Director General of Abdul Hamid Shoman Scientific & Cultural Foundation, a Member of the Supreme Palestinian Political Leadership in the "State of Palestine" – Government in Exile; and an Independent Member of the Palestine National Council and an Independent Member of the Palestine Central Council. His titles also include Chairman, Board of Trustees & Director General, The Encyclopedia Palestina, and Member, Board of Directors of the Foundation.

Dr. Rahman's academic credits include a Ph.D. in Political Science – University of Calgary, Alberta, Canada (1973),

and his MA in Public Administration - American University of Beirut, Beirut – Lebanon (1967). He was a Full Professor at the University of Kuwait – Political Science Department - 1983; and a Visiting Professor at the - University of Jordan (Part-time) - 1992-1994; University of Jordan (summer semester) Amman, Jordan - 1976; and American University - Washington, USA - 1980. Dr. Rahman is the author of (19) books and more than (46) refereed academic studies dealing with different aspects of Comparative Government, International Politics, Palestine issue, the Zionist Movement, the Arab Israeli politics. He has been a regular contributor for the last 35 years, on a weekly basis, to a number of Arab newspapers.



José Said Saffie is President of the "Bethlehem 2000 Palestinian Foundation," the most important Chilean non-

profit organization created to help Palestinian children in the Holy Land. José Said, born in Perú, is the founder and current head of Parque Arauco S.A., which is one of the largest real estate developers and operators of shopping malls in both Chile and Argentina.

Mr. Said has a law degree from the University of Chile. In addition. he is President of BBVA (Banco Bilbao Vizcayas Argentina) Bank, Chile; Director Mega Plaza (Sociedad de Centros Comerciale) Lima, Peru; Acting Director of the Banking and Financial Institutions Association (Asociacio'n de Bancos e Instituciones Financieras); Advisor to the Alberto Hurtado Jesuit University; Director of the Chile-Peru Business Council; and President Chile-Arab Business Council. Mr. Said has also received numerous awards as an outstanding businessman, investor and public-spirited citizen.



**Dr. Saliba Sarsar** is Associate Vice President for Global Initiatives at Monmouth University, NJ. He is a Middle East scholar

and commentator on the region. He received and/or directed grants from the Fulbright, the Kellogg, the Dodge, and the Peace Development foundations. He is co-author and co-editor of books on political life, world politics, leadership, and Palestinian affairs. He is co-editor with Fr. Drew Christiansen, S.I., of an anthology entitled, H. B. Patriarch Michel Sabbah: Leading with Faith, Witnessing for Peace with Justice. Among his published articles are "Palestinian Christians: Religion, Conflict and the Struggle for Just Peace" in Holy Land Studies and "Palestinian Christians—In Their Own Words" in Sightings, published by the Martin Marty Center of the Institute for the Advanced Study of Religion at the University of Chicago.

Dr. Sarsar is the recipient of numerous awards including the *Global Visionary Award* from Monmouth University in 2007, the *Stafford Presidential Award of Excellence* from Monmouth University in 2006, and the *Humanitarian Award* from the National Conference for Community and Justice in 2001. This organization has brought Arab Americans and American Jews together to stimulate dialogue and peaceful coexistence initiatives. He serves on the boards of directors of the Two Rivers Film Festival, the American Task Force on Palestine, and the Jacob Landau Institute.

Born in Jerusalem, Dr. Saliba's early education was at the Christian Brothers Academy and St. Joseph College in the Old City of Jerusalem. He earned a B.A. in Political Science and Interdisciplinary History, *summa cum laude*, from Monmouth College in 1978. He earned a Ph.D. from Rutgers University in Political Science, specializing in international relations and Middle Eastern affairs in 1984.



**Saba L. Shami** has over 26 years of government relations and state government work in Washington and Richmond advising

an ambassador, a president of a grass roots national organization and working for two Virginia Governors, first as key campaign advisor and then as top political appointee. Mr. Shami served the Commonwealth of Virginia for 10 years in several key positions under Governors Mark R. Warner and Timothy M. Kaine - Assistant Commissioner at the DMV, Special Assistant to the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, Chief Deputy Commissioner of Agriculture & Consumer Services and Chief Deputy Director of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation. Most recently he served as Director of Special Projects at the

Virginia Port Authority between January 2009 and August 2011.

Before joining the Warner Administration Mr. Shami served as principal/owner of *Washington Works LLC*, a public affairs firm, working with different interest groups and promoting their points of view on Capitol Hill, in the different departments and federal agencies in Washington, and with the Virginia State Government

Mr. Shami is a graduate of Goshen College in Indiana, attended Bethany Theological Seminary in Oak Brook, Illinois and is a graduate of the Virginia Executive Institute - VEI. He is fluent in several languages.



**Hashim Shawa** is the Chairman and General Manager of the Bank of Palestine, assuming this position in 2007.

The Bank is the first and largest national bank of Palestine. After receiving the B.Sc. (Honors) from University College of London, Mr. Shawa began his banking career at Citigroup in 1997. There he held various management positions in corporate and private banking working in the UK, Italy, Spain and Switzerland. In 2005 he joined HSBC in Switzerland as a director of the bank's Middle East and North Africa business. He developed the HSBC private banking business in the Gulf and established its onshore presence in Kuwait.



William Joseph Turner studied at the University of Windsor, formerly Assumption University, which included a scholarship

to Rome, attaining a Bachelors Degree in Philosophy and Education in 1972. He held teaching positions at Assumption College School, Windsor, and then at Trinity High School in Louisville Kentucky. While in Kentucky, he was honored by the Governor of the State in 1973 and also named an honorary citizen of Louisville in 1974.

In the fall of 1973, he entered Mt. St Mary Seminary in Cincinnati and was ordained a deacon on April 23, 1977. He was ordained priest at the Peterborough Cathedral on April 1, 1979, and served in various capacities, including Master of Ceremonies for the Diocese, Chair of the Liturgical Commission, parochial vicar at two parishes and Director of the Television Mass Outreach (1980-84.)

In 1984 he was given permission by his bishop to serve a six year term as chaplain in the Canadian navy. While in that capacity he served on three bases and as Fleet Chaplain. He was honorably released in 1990 with the rank of Commander. In the fall of 1997 he was incardinated into the Lansing Diocese, while serving as parochial vicar at St. John Church in Fenton, Michigan for 11 months. In March of 1998 he was appointed pastor of St. Mary Church in Chelsea, Michigan, where he still resides. In addition to his pastoral duties in Chelsea, a parish of over 1150 families, he earned a PhD in Cultural Anthropology in 2000 with studies and research conducted nearby at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.

He was appointed an Associate Professor in 2001, and currently mentors graduate students of anthropology in the completion of their degrees. He has been published in numerous articles and has written two books in the study of culture, faith, ethnicity and their relationships. He is a charter member of the Society for Catholic Liturgy. He holds citizenships in the United States, Canada and the European Community. Father Turner continues to promote the cause of peace and understanding for the Holy Land Christians and among the people of the Holy Land through annual pilgrimages to visit the peoples there and by supporting the ministry and other programs of the Patriarch.



Ambassador Philip C. Wilcox, Jr. (Ret.) is President of the Foundation for Middle East Peace, a Washington

D.C.-based foundation devoted to fostering peace between Israelis and Palestinians. He retired from the U.S. Foreign Service in September 1997 after 31 years of service.

Born in Denver, CO on February 1, 1937, he attended public schools there. He graduated from Williams College with a B.A. in History in 1958, and obtained an LL.B. from the Stanford Law School in 1961.

Ambassador Wilcox entered the Foreign Service in 1966. He has served abroad at U.S. embassies in various capacities: as Press Attachè in Vientiane (Laos), Political and Economic/Commercial Officer in Jakarta (Indonesia), and as Chief of the Economic/Commercial

Section in Dhaka (Bangladesh). His last overseas assignment was as Chief of Mission and U.S. Consul General in Jerusalem. At the U.S. State Department, Ambassador Wilcox has served as Special Assistant to the Undersecretary for Management, Deputy Director for UN Political Affairs in the Bureau of International Organization Affairs, Director for Regional Affairs in the Bureau for Middle Eastern and South Asian Affairs, Director for Israeli and Arab-Israeli Affairs and Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Middle Eastern Affairs. He also served as Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Intelligence and Research and as Ambassador-at-Large and Coordinator for Counter-Terrorism.

After his retirement, Ambassador Wilcox was appointed by the Secretary of State to serve as a member of an Accountability Review Board, chaired by Admiral William Crowe (Ret.) to examine and make recommendations concerning the terrorist bombing of the American Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya on August 7, 1998.

Ambassador Wilcox speaks French and Indonesian. He is a graduate of the National War College, and has been awarded the U.S. State Department's Meritorious, Superior, and Presidential Honor Awards. He is a board member of the Middle East Institute and Americans for Near East Refugee Aid (ANERA) and a member of The Washington Institute for Foreign Affairs and Dacor-Bacon House. He and his wife Cynda live in Bethesda, MD.



**Dr. James J. Zogby** is founding president of the Arab American Institute (AAI), a Washington, D.C.based organization that serves as the

political and policy research arm of the Arab American community. Since AAI's founding in 1985, he and AAI have led Arab American efforts to secure political empowerment in the U.S. Through voter registration, education and mobilization, AAI has moved Arab Americans into the political mainstream.

For the past three decades, Dr. Zogby has been intimately involved in Arab American issues. He was co-founder and chairman of the Palestine Human Rights Campaign in the late 1970s. Later he co-founded and served as the Executive Director of the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee. In 1982, he co-founded Save Lebanon, Inc., a private non-profit, humanitarian and nonsectarian relief organization that funds health care for Palestinian and Lebanese victims of war, and other social welfare projects in Lebanon.

In 1993, following the signing of the Israeli-Palestinian peace accord in Washington, at the request of Vice President Al Gore he lead Builders for Peace, a private sector committee promoting U.S. business investment in the West Bank and Gaza. As its copresident, he frequently participated in delegations led by the Vice President and the late Secretary of Commerce Ron Brown to the Middle East. In 1994, with former U.S. Congressman Mel Levine, co-president of Builders for Peace, he led a U.S. delegation to the signing of the Israeli-Palestinian agreement in Cairo. That year he chaired the Palestinian Economy Forum at the Casablanca Economic Summit. After 1994, through Builders, he worked with a number of US agencies including AID, OPIC, USTDA, and the Departments of State and Commerce to promote and support Palestinian economic development,

Dr. Zogby has been active in U.S. politics for many years. In 1984 and 1988 he served as deputy campaign manager and senior advisor to the Jesse Jackson Presidential campaigns. In 1995 DNC Chairman Don Fowler appointed him as co-convener of the National Democratic Ethnic Coordinating Committee (NDECC), an umbrella organization of Democratic Party leaders of European and Mediterranean descent. In 1999 and 2001 he was reelected to that post. In 2001, he was appointed to the Executive Committee of the Democratic National Committee (DNC). In 2006 he was named co-chair of the DNC's Resolutions Committee.





# Christians of the Holy Land

### Who are they?

For two thousand years, Christian families have lived and worshipped in the land where Jesus lived, died, and was resurrected. These Christians are not immigrants or converts. They are the descendents of those who first believed in Jesus Christ (Acts 2:11). Ethnically, whether they live in Israel, the West Bank or Gaza they are overwhelmingly Palestinian. Denominationally, they are Orthodox, Catholic, and Protestant. Together, they remain the first Church, the "Mother Church". Many Christians from around the world are unaware there is an indigenous Arab Christian population in the Holy Land. Even fewer know the severity of the conditions they endure.

In a Nutshell:

"We are thinkers, we are theologians, we are philosophers, we are teachers, we are believers in the Bible and in Jesus Christ and we are rolling up our sleeves and are making a difference by shedding light in a bleak situation because nothing will stand between us and the Lord". Fr. Firas Arideh, Palestinian Christian

### Why are they leaving?

In the last 60 years the Christian population has gone from 18% of the population to less than 2% today.

In 2004, all the Heads of all the Churches in Jerusalem came together to address the cause of this stating: "Occupation remains the root cause of the conflict and of the continued suffering in the Holy Land". *(Statement on the Wall)* 

HCEF leaves the politics to the politicians – our focus is the people. And in our service to the people, we must bring to light the things that harm them, in this case the Israeli occupation. With this military control came the confiscation of Christian lands and the demolition of Christian homes. With this came the building of concrete walls of separation, separating Palestinians from Israelis, from other Palestinians and even at times from their own families. With the building of these walls came the loss of food and water resources. Many have lost their jobs or have become deprived of medical care at hospitals which are no longer accessible. Christians are often denied the freedom to worship. Many church leaders have been prevented from passing through checkpoints to minister to the sick or dying.

The inability of families to cover the basic cost of living, to cope with high inflation, to educate their sons and daughters, has increased emigration. If current trends continue, in 20 years there may be no Christians left in the land Jesus walked. The Christian community of the Holy Land, the people of Calvary, will not allow their hope to die. Neither can we.

## **REASONS TO SUPPORT** the Native Christians of the Holy Land

- 1. The native Christians are the Palestinian Arab descendents of the first faithful. They were present at Pentecost (Acts2:11) and are present there today. For 2000 years, they have maintained a continuous living witness in the land Jesus walked. Among an increasingly non-Christian population they bear witness to the Christian heritage of the Holy Land.
- 2. We are brothers and sisters in Christ. As Paul wrote, the Church is like a body. It has many parts but remains one Body united by one Spirit. As our eyes open to other cultures, perspectives, and ways of worshiping the same Lord, our shared faith is deepened.
- 3. Christian Palestinians are a bridge to peace for a troubled region. They alone share the Old Testament with Jews and the same culture, history and language as Muslims. They act as bridges between those mired in political conflict and offer hope for a peaceful resolution.
- 4. They ensure the younger generation is raised in Christ. The continuity of the Christian presence in the Holy Land depends upon the preservation of its schools. In addition, these offer young Christians a place to interact with each other and share and grow in their faith.

- 5. They ensure Churches and Holy Sites remain places of Christian worship. Without the indigenous Christian presence in the Holy Land, these would turn into empty museums, devoid of the warmth of the people or be appropriated for other uses.
- 6. More Christians are leaving the Holy Land. The pressures and economic conditions created by the long term occupation of communities, by the Israeli military, cause many to leave. This has further reduced a Christian population that was already a minority.
- 7. Christians are being oppressed. Living conditions in the Holy Land are dire as a result of this occupation which drastically restricts freedom of movement; cutting these Christians off from the larger world. Few can travel to work, find medical care, afford housing or worship freely.
- 8. We are called to help those in need. Jesus ministered to the needs of the poor, the afflicted, and the oppressed. He calls us to do the same. It is our duty to help sustain our brothers and sisters in the Holy Land before there are none left.
